World Communion Sunday



WE GIVE BECAUSE . . .:

Much has been given, Jesus invites us to make a difference. The Bible is clear. Galatians 6:2, NRSV says, "Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." Jesus says it this way, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 19:19b).

Through our Shared Ministries all of us giving together allows United Methodists to do together what we cannot do alone. When you give on World Communion Sunday, you enable vital ministries that change the world, one life at a time. Church is open for Sunday Service!


For those who feel comfortable attending church, we are looking for volunteers to help with Sunday Services now that we have reopened our doors. We need:
